The topics covered included the outbreak of the red-banded stink bug, resistant bollworms, water conservation and the responsible use of the Dicamba herbicide. Agronomists from different areas of the Southeast shared the patterns and trends they observed in different regions. Our production team took home detailed notes in order to implement improvements for our upcoming season.





We also educated ourselves on the business side of farming at the Family Farms Group Win-

ter Conference held in Tampa, Florida. The theme of the conference was The Shark Tank: Implementation Is Everything. We heard from Johnny Georges, the founder of the Tree T-Pee, who shared his overnight success story and his passion for helping farmers. While on the real Shark Tank TV show, Johnny became teary eyed after explaining why he would not raise his retail prices for the Tree T-Pee. When asked to raise his prices to make more money, Johnny quickly responded with the answer "but you are selling to farmers". The fruits of their partnership have facilitated the growth of plants in drought stricken areas all while charging a reasonable and affordable price for their product.
